The Measured Quality - 2003 results were provided to Cabinet in a Security Classification 'A' Information Submission on 10 June 2003.

The Measured Quality - 2004 dissemination strategy, endorsed by Dr John Scott, SEDHS on 22 March 2004, is to proceed on the basis that reports are disseminated to each Health Service District, identify and report their 'Key Indicators', and following this process the reports are to proceed to Cabinet, with Minister and Director General briefed.

- 1. The Measured Quality team commenced the process of disseminating the 2004 performance indicator results for 76 hospitals through 38 Health Service District (inc: Mater) presentations across Queensland Health on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2004. The final presentation was undertaken on 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2004 (12 weeks).
- 2. Each of the 76 Hospitals have now provided a list of their 'Key Indicators' from Measured Quality 2004 and will investigate these and provide feedback on:
  - Investigation / Evaluation
  - Management / Action Plan
  - Opportunity to communicate best practice to other facilities
  - · Contact name
- 3. This feedback is analysed by the Measured Quality Team,
  - and successful improvement activities identified, peer reviewed, and recognised as a current OH improvement / best practice activity.
  - Inadequate responses are collated and forwarded to each Zone for advice on further action
- 4. Each of the Zonal Management Units have endorsed the list of 'Key Indicators' for each of their Districts.
- 5. In accordance with the 2004 dissemination strategy the reports and key indicators are now due to be provided to Cabinet as a security classification 'A' cabinet information submission, with Minister and Director General briefed.
